By day, you'll discover natural beauty spots where birdlife thrives and by night, you'll enjoy expert help identifying what you've spotted.

TRIP SUITABILITY

Though these holidays don't cover great distances on foot, they are still active. You'll be hopping on and off the coach and should expect to spend the majority of the day on your feet. Walking to the birdwatching sites may take you across country tracks or footpaths and, at times, off the beaten track so be sure to bring sturdy shoes.

ITINERARY

Day 1: Arrival Day

Check-in at the hotel is available from 16:00. If you are a member you can arrive at the house from 14:00 in 2026. Enjoy a complimentary cream tea at 16:30 and meet other guests. After dinner this evening, your local ornithologist leader will introduce themselves and the itinerary. They'll also give an introductory talk on the local area's birdlife and what you're likely to see during your holiday.

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Day 3: Sizergh Castle gardens & beyond

Sizergh Castle We'll begin our second day at Sizergh Castle. The sizeable grounds of this 16th-century stately home in Kendal are one of the best sites in the area to look for the elusive Hawfinch. After exploring the grounds we'll head to Helsington Barrows to see if we hear or even possibly see, Crossbill, and then to Roudsea Wood, with its ancient yews, to see what other wildlife we can spot. Please note entrance fees to Sizergh Castle gardens have not been included in the price of the holiday. We know many of you are National Trust members and will be able to access for free – please remember to bring your membership card. Any non-members, please allow approx. £5 per person for entrance fee.

Day 4: Morecambe Bay & the Lune Estuary

Morecambe Bay We round off our holiday with a visit to Hest Bank RSPB reserve on the east side of Morecambe Bay, another nationally important wader site. Then, we'll enjoy a gentle stroll along nearby Morecambe promenade, very rewarding for birdwatchers at this time of year. The Lune Estuary Finally, we'll head south to the Lune estuary where the saltmarshes, pools, and creeks around Glasson Dock offer sanctuary for Common Redshank, Northern Lapwing, Dunlin, Eurasian Wigeon, and Common Snipes.

Day 5: Departure Day

Enjoy a leisurely breakfast before making your way home.

Thorns Hall

Delivering on all fronts for countryside lovers, this cosy Grade II-listed manor house is just a skip away from Sedbergh – the Cumbrian market town treasured for its cobbled streets, public school, artisan shops, and bookshops (it's known as England's official book town for good reason). You'll also have the Yorkshire Dales National Park on your doorstep as well as the Howgill Fells - the small group of hills adored by legendary fellwalker, illustrator, and guidebook author Alfred Wainwright. The walking opportunities here are outstanding, but if you fancy travelling further afield there's Kendal (home of the mint cake), Hawes, Wensleydale, Appleby-in-Westmorland, and Lake Windemere all within easy driving distance.

A warm welcome

We want you to feel comfortable from the moment you arrive. You'll find a welcome pack in your room with guest registration forms, menus, order forms for dinners and picnic lunches, the Wi-Fi password, and the front door code. Our houses are locked at night, so we recommend noting the Duty Manager's number on arrival in case of an emergency (or getting locked out).

Evening entertainment

While evening entertainment varies from house to house, HF Holidays Inter-House Quiz night held after dinner on Wednesdays is a weekly staple. Your HF Holidays leader may be around for tips on guided and self-guided walking routes as well as visit-worthy local attractions.

Walks talks

Our HF Holidays walk leaders host guided walking information briefings before dinner on guided walking holiday arrival days. This is followed by a group Walks Talk for information on the following day's guided walks (held before dinner every evening). Self-guided walking guests are, of course, welcome.

The walking day

Prior to setting off on guided walks, your HF Holidays Leader will run you through a short safety briefing. There's also an up-to-date weather forecast on display at the house to ensure you have appropriate clothing and footwear. If you choose to do your own walks or are on a self-guided walking holiday, we ask that you please complete an Independent Walker Card each day. These can be found near the Discovery Point in the house.
